- 1. The Striking Calamity
 - This refers to the Day of Judgment, a day that will strike the hearts with fear and shock.
- 2. What is the Striking Calamity?
 - o A rhetorical question to emphasize how serious and terrifying this day will be.
- 3. And what can make you know what is the Striking Calamity?
 - This repeats the question to stress that no one can fully understand how intense this event will be.
- 4. It is the Day when people will be like moths, dispersed.
 - o On that day, people will be scattered in confusion, moving around like moths flying aimlessly towards a light.
- 5. And the mountains will be like wool, fluffed up.
 - The strong mountains will become weightless and soft, like fluffy wool blown around by the wind.
- 6. Then as for one whose scales are heavy [with good deeds],
 - Those who have done many good deeds will have their good deeds weigh heavy on the scale.
- 7. He will be in a pleasant life.
 - o These people will live a happy and comfortable life in Paradise.
- 8. But as for one whose scales are light,
 - Those who didn't do enough good deeds, or did more bad than good, will have light scales.
- 9. His refuge will be an abyss.
 - o Their final home will be a deep, terrible pit (Hell).
- 10. And what can make you know what that is?
 - o Again, this stresses how terrifying this abyss will be.
- 11. It is a Fire, intensely hot.
 - o This is a fire hotter and more painful than anything we can imagine
